Vishinsky, Soviet Vice Commissar for Foreign Affairs; Soviet Foreign Minister Vyashaslav Molotov. The Soviet official between Vishinsky and Molotov is A. B. Podtserob. Directly behind Molotov is Mr. Tsarapkin, Mr. Novikov, Mr. Arutyunyan and unidentified Soviet official. On the far right, holding papers in his lap, is Averell Harriman.
