It was brought to my attention by Mr. Walter White of the NAACP that there is segregation of races in federal offices and in the Army which could be abolished without the use of the Civil Rights legislation. I was told that, by Executive order, for at least a year, a Fair Employment Practice Commission may be set up.

I understand that it may be inappropriate now to take such steps, but is there any assurance that such may be done in the future?
