I CAN SEE NO OBJECTION TO RUSSIAN PROPOSAL THAT

COSTS AND EXPENSES OF INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL AND OF PROSECUTION

BE MADE A CHARGE AGAINST THE CONTROL COUNCIL AND THEREBY INCLUDED IN THE BILL AGAINST GERMANY. THE ONLY REASON FOR THE

PRESENT PROVISIONS IN THE DRAFT ARE THAT WE THOUGHT THERE A

CONVENITED METHOD BUT ON RECONSIDERATION I THINK THE RUSSIAN

PROPOSAL IS PREFERABLE. I HAVE COMMUNICATED WITH GENERAL WEIR

OF THE WAR DEPARTMENT WHO IS GOING TO PUT IT UP TO GENERAL

EISENHOWER AND COMMUNICATE WITH YOU DIRECTLY ABOUT IT. FROM

SAN FRANCISCO WE INFORMED GENERAL BISENHOWER GENERALLY ABOUT

PROPOSALS BUT I THINK IT WELL THAT YOU KEEP THE AMERICAN MEMBERS



FIRST DAYS CONFERENCES INDICATE A GOOD DEAL OF REVISION IN FORM BUT GENERAL AGREEMENT BY ALL PARTIES IN SUBSTANCE. IF FUNDAMENTAL GROUNDS OF DIFFERENCE EXIST, THEY HAVE NOT APPEARED. RUSSIANS PROPOSE THAT COSTS AND EXPENSES OF INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL AND OF PROSECUTION BE MADE A CHARGE AGAINST THE CONTROL COUNCIL AND THEREBY INCLUDED IN THE BILL AGAINST GERMANY. I DO NOT KNOW REASONS FOR PRESENT PROVISIONS THAT EXPENSES SHALL BE BORNE BY THE SIGNATORIES, NOR DO I KNOW THE MERITS OF THE PROPOSITION TO CHARGE AGAINST CONTROL COMMISSION. HOW FAR HAVE AMERICAN MEMBERS CONTROL COMMISSION BEEN CONSULTED AND SHOULD NOT THIS PROPOSAL AND OTHER PROVISIONS BE CLEARED WITH CLAY OR EISENHOWER?
