My dear Dr. Robinson:

In line with our recent conversations here in Washington our work on War Crimes as originally planned is now drawing to a conclusion. From time to time I shall send special supplementary reports to the continent based on new documentation, but generally the basic report is virtually complete. I have not forgotten my promise and in the very near future I shall make our work available to you.

I am now very much interested in the preparation of the report on the Jewish situation in Poland, as I believe that a properly and well prepared study at this time might help to offset some of the negative material now appearing and may be of great assistance.

I hope your staff will be able to start work on it soon. This report should be thoroughly footnoted (whenever any source is used it should be referred to). The study should contain a basic but brief summary of the change in size and character of the Jewish population, the attitudes of the Provisional Government, Russia, and the Emigres. There should also be some mention of past difficulties, the situation in the Polish Army, and the present hopeless situation within the country itself. If you have any further ideas, I rely on your discretion.
