Dear Dr. Dewar:

Enclosed we are sending you the following:

1. Dossiers on Schecht and Frick, with exhibits.
(The dossier on Rosenberg was ready but, at the last moment, a new document was found which we deem very important. We are therefore reshaping this dossier accordingly. It will be sent to you tomorrow.)
2. A supplementary study on Concentration Camps. As you will recall, in our Charge VIII, Mass Annihilations, we already have a section on concentration camps, dealing mostly with the extermination camps in the East. The present study is a general survey of the intent and purpose which is at the bottom of the system of concentration camps and of the camps discovered with the progression and advance of the armies of the United Nations in Western Europe (France, Belgium) and later in Germany itself.
Moreover, it also includes a study of the two important death camps in the East, Majdanek and Auschwitz (Oswiecim).
We think that this new section on Concentration Camps, combined with that on the same subject which figures in our Charge VIII, Mass Annihilation, can be included -- if it is still possible and if it is in conformity with your plan -- in the new charge, "Organized Violence" which you have introduced.
3. The study on Streicher contains references to and quotations from the nine photostatic exhibits.
(The Streicher study and one exhibit were sent to you yesterday, without a covering letter.)

We are trying as much as possible to speed up the sending of the individual dossiers.
